Remtech were engaged to undertake the remedial facade repairs to the prestigious Reserve Bank of Australia.

The RBA building located at 20-23 London Circuit, Canberra is heritage listed and included on the Commonwealth Heritage List. The two storey building was constructed in 1965 by Civil and Civic Pty Ltd to a design by Howlett and Bailey Architects.

SCOPE OF WORKS

The purpose of the Works is to repair damaged areas of the marble cladding to the building facade and various waterproofing details, together with associated miscellaneous repair Work such as sealant replacement and cleaning to make good the facade finishes.

- Establishing the site, including installation of all required access and protection to comply with authority requirements
- Replacement of failed sealant joints to the marble cladding panels
- Repair of spalled marble cladding panels
- Replacement of deteriorated glazing sealant to the affected facade areas
- Design and implement appropriate allowance for drainage overflows to the sunshade guide channels
- Installation of additional roof vents to equalise air pressure within the roof void
- Re-detailing of all existing roof penetrations and implement repairs
- Addition of locking mechanism to the sunshade frames
- Full clean of the entire building facade
